Test Scores Composites Explained

Valid results and scores within normal limits are determined based on a comparison of your performance to a large representative database.

A valid baseline test can be used by a <u>healthcare provider</u> in the event you suffer a possible concussion (i.e. sports injury, fall, auto accident, etc.). **Test results should always be interpreted by a trained healthcare provider.**

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Verbal Memory

Evaluates attentional processes, learning, and memory within the verbal domain during the Word Memory, Symbol Match and Three Letter Match tasks.













Total Symptom

Presents summary information regarding self-reported symptom data. A higher score reflects a higher symptom total.



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Visual Memory

Evaluates visual attention and scanning, learning, and memory during the Design Memory and X's & O's tasks.



Visual Motor Speed

Evaluates visual processing, learning and memory and visual-motor response speed during the X's & O's and the Three Letter Memory tasks.



Reaction Time

Evaluates your average response speed to tasks presented during X's & O's, Symbol Match and Color Match tasks.



Provides the sum of errors committed during different phases of the test and is

useful in determining test validity.
